

SpeechPage's INTRODUCTORY EXPRESSIVE REPORTING ACTIVITY!

1. Print out the pages and glue the window, door & box cover scene pages each to the front of a file folder.



2. Print & Laminate the pages with the larger cards and cut them out.



3. Place one picture at a time inside the matching folder. (A small piece of tape may help to hold it in place.) Shut the folder.



4. Ask the client to look through the window (or in the door, box): (i.e. open the file folder & peek inside.) Then ask the client: "What did you see outside of the window?"
The intent is that they appropriately 'expressively report' an answer.




OPTIONAL INTRO AUGMENTATIVE/ALTERNATIVE COMMUNICATION (AAC) ADDITIONAL USAGE IDEA:

Set up the client's *appropriate AAC system* using the matching communication symbol(s). (For example: velcro them onto a binder or overlay-based speech generating device.)

The intent is that the client use these matching symbols to express with AAC to the communicative partner their answer to the question of "What did you see?" *This activity is designed to provide a motivating environment for an initial level of expressive AAC that is not requesting, but rather it is a responding & reporting type activity.*

An **OPTIONAL "I saw a..."** sentence strip is included for clients working at the sentence building level.



5. Advance Usage Ideas: Describing Items Using Details: Instead of naming it, ask the client to give details about what they saw (Ex: "It has four legs.") and have other group members guess what it might be, based on that clue. Continue with one description & guess at a time until the correct picture is named.

The intent is that the client is learning to use their expressive communication to report what they have seen. Minimize prompts. Allow them to independently express!
